

Anne-Laura van Harmelen is professor of Brain, Safety and Resilience at the Institute of Education and Child Studies at Leiden University and an affiliated senior researcher at the University of Cambridge. van Harmelen leads the interdisciplinary Social Resilience and Security programme, which brings together key expertise across the social sciences, Archaeology, Law, Global Governance and Affairs and humanities with key stakeholders to research key outstanding questions in the field of societal resilience and security. Van Harmelen obtained her PhD in Psychology at Leiden University where she studied the effects of childhood trauma on the brain. After her PhD she focussed her research on the neurobiological and social mechanisms that aid resilience after childhood trauma, for which she obtained a Dorothy Hodgkin Fellowship from the Royal Society, an MQ brighter Futures award and a VIDI grant from the Netherlands Society for Scientific Research. For her work, van Harmelen was awarded the Association for Psychological Sciences rising star award and a Medical Research Council Emerging leader in adolescent mental health award.
